## Charity Organization YPO & Habitat for Humanity


In the light of recent Palu, Sigi, and Donggala tsunami disaster, the OXSID and AUSCI are taking initiatives to raise fund for victims by donating all profits from this event to build Transitional Shelters for affected families. The T-Shelters project initiated by the Habitat for Humanity Indonesia aims to build as many as 4,000 units in disaster-affected areas in Central Sulawesi.


Transitional shelter provides a habitable covered living space and a secure, healthy living environment, with privacy and dignity, to those within it, during the period between a conflict or natural disaster and the achievement of a durable shelter solution.

The shelter should be durable enough to last the entire transition period, until reconstruction is complete, and should be able to be upgraded or relocated to different sites. It should use simple techniques and rapid construction methods appropriate to the environment and community with which it is being implemented.

It has been successfully implemented during 2006 Yogyakarta earthquake.







This charity event will serve as joint effort together with the Young Presidents' Organization (YPO) to build 265 units which will be constructed for the communities of Poi Village, South Dolo District in the Region of Sigi, Central Sulawesi Province. One 18-sqm unit is estimated to cost IDR 25 Million (approximately USD 1,800).
